Message from our Headteacher

Welcome back to the second half of our Autumn Term. Last half term we had a whole school local authority evaluation. Some of the comments from the evaluation are below.

- Behaviour at Russell Street is outstanding because, policies are clear, and practice aligns with that policy. All staff share the same high expectations and model this to children through a shared language.
- There is a tangible ethos and culture of high expectations and respect supporting children to build towards higher executive function.
- Children demonstrate consistently high levels of self-regulation and low-level disruption is rare.
- Safeguarding has a high priority with exemplary practice.
- Every classroom, outdoor space and social time is productive and focused with excellent routines and expectations.
- Interactions between adults/children and children/children are purposeful and polite and the learning environment, conducive to high quality learning.
- The school immerses children in learning, vocabulary, stories and knowledge through its' continuous provision, displays and highquality resourcing in every cleverly designed space.
- The EYFS curriculum has been designed as the foundational knowledge and skills for pupils to be ready to access the curriculum in Y1 and then develop this into Y2.
- GLD continues to be significantly above MK and national (89% 2024 compared to 67% National and 70% MK 2023).
- Transitions between each phase and year group are strong because of staff knowledge of the children.
- Staff have high expectations for all pupils and adult/child interactions are learning and vocabulary focused.
- There are clear expectations of pupils' phonic progress term by term from Reception to year 2.
- Pupils are given sufficient practice in reading and re-reading books so that they develop fluency.
- Great thought has gone into developing the reading curriculum.
- Writing and maths outcomes and the quality of children's work is exceptionally high as shown in moderated examples of Y2
- Leadership at Russell Street is characterised by a relentless commitment to the children and their development, and this is in evidence throughout the school. There is a cohesion and consistency across the school which demonstrates the skilful way in which the Head's vision has been embedded. With total dedication from her staff, she has carefully prioritised and implemented learning experiences that enable all children to thrive.

Poppies plus other related items will be for sale on the KS1 & Reception gates and Nursery door during morning drop-off. Items can also be purchased from the school office.






Anti-bullying Week - Odd Socks Day - Tuesday 12th November
