The closing date is 15th January 2025 and all applications must be made before the closing date to receive a school place offer on 16th April 2025 (national offer day).

Big Garden Birdwatch 2025 - 24th – 26th January

Every Birdwatch counts - Across the UK, over 600,000 people took part in Big Garden Birdwatch 2024, counting a whopping 9.7 million birds! House Sparrows took the top spot, but counts of these chirpy birds are down by 60% compared to the first Birdwatch in 1979. In fact, we've lost 38 million birds from UK skies in the last 60 years. With birds facing so many challenges, it's more important than ever to get involved in the Birdwatch. Every bird you do — or don't — count will give the RSPB a valuable insight into how garden birds are faring.
